

**SPECIAL MEETING  
NAVAJO COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
TUESDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, 2006  
HOPI TRIBAL HEADQUARTERS**

**The meeting was called to order by the Hopi Tribal Council at 9:00 a.m.**

**Introductions:** Council Members were introduced as well as members of the Navajo County Board of Supervisors and staff. Attending from Navajo County were: Jesse Thompson, Chairman; Percy Deal, Vice Chairman; J.R. DeSpain, David Tenney and Jerry Brownlow, Members; James Jayne, County Manager; June Foard, Board Secretary.

**Proposition 400 presentation:** James G. Jayne presented information regarding proposed Proposition 400 and how it will affect county residents. He explained that taxes would not be raised. Discussion followed with several questions from council members regarding the affect the proposition will have on services including Law Enforcement availability and voter registration on the reservation. Mr. Polacca thanked Mr. Thompson for the help. He indicated they were feeling a financial crunch since the coal mine has shut down.

**Presentation of voter registration and early voting information:** Doris Clark reported on several problems on the reservation with voter registration and information dissemination.

**Voter Identification Requirements:** Bernalda Navasie provided information regarding identification requirements at the polls explaining that there were not many problems. There was some confusion as people did not realize there is a conditional provision that identification can be provided up to 5 days after the election.

**Discussion of items of mutual interest to the Hopi Tribal Council and Navajo County :** Hopi Tribal Council Members and Supervisors discussed the proposed Detox center in Holbrook. Chairman Thompson reported that Supervisor DeSpain and he were attending the meetings regarding the proposed center. Other general discussion was held. It was suggested that more joint meetings be held as they are very beneficial.

**Adjourn:** The Hopi Council recessed for lunch at 12:15 p.m. and the Navajo County delegation departed at that time.
